

Covenant, BOSCH partner to promote Skill Acquisition, Entrepreneurship, Sustainable Education

Obtaining technical and vocational skills along with their professional qualifications makes them even more confident to take on the challenges of life as well as become employers of labor after graduation," Mr Ajayi explained.

In his remarks, the Vice-Chancellor, Professor AAA. Atayero, noted that additive manufacturing would be the hallmark of the 4th Industrial Revolution and as such, Covenant, in partnering with BOSCH, would start with the tools. This, he said, would develop the industries and people who could use the tools.

Professor Atayero added that the tool aspect would be integrated into the Students Work Experience Programme (SWEP) for the Train the Trainer Programme for Covenant students

The approval from the university management and the immediate take-off plan is in line with the University's vision to become one of the top 10 universities in the world in a few years' time.
